FARM IN SAME FAMILY 100 YEARS HAS BEEN SOLD

The McDougall farm on Highway No. 25, about two miles south of Acton has been sold to Mr. Evan Jones, Acton, who will soon take possession. The old homestead of 100 acres is one of the early settled farms in the district, and has remained in possession of the McDougall family for 100 years. The patent from the Crown was issued in 1822 to James Crawford. In 1836 Hector Russell and John Mackenzie purchased the land and 6 years later, in 1842, sold it to Hon. Peter McGill. In 1846 John McDougall, father of the present owner, Duncan McDougall purchased the land, who transferred the property to the son. In these days of many farm changes, a century holding by one family is indeed unusual. Mr. McDougall is retiring owing to falling health. It is also interesting to note that in 1862 one rood of land was given to Dublin School for a well. The property was never used and the land reverted back into the farm holding.
