Jack Toet had a nice specimen to exhibit last week. His fish was 17 inches long, 12 inches in girth and weighed 2 and three quarter pounds. It just goes to show that you can't tell

how big the fish are in the streams around here. By the way, it wasn't a bass, either, it was a speckled brook trout.
