Board of Trade Secretary Writes From Nevada

The editor was pleased to receive a letter from W. E. Nodwell, who has been missed from his job as secretary of the Board of Trade while making an extended trip through the western United States. Mr. Nodwell was in the state of Nevada at time of writing, and had just passed through the Arizona desert. Camping out in the Nevada cattle country, he says: "I'll be reaching for the blackboard tonight, which is quite a change from a few days ago when I was below sea level and it was around 100 in the shade." He describes the fascinating desert areas, where from sand and heat one ranges through intense irrigation farming to mountains and snow, each elevation with different plant and animal life. Those who know what excellent photographs Mr. Nodwell has taken around this district, will be glad to know that he has started to do some color photography, and one of his first was a shot of Roy Rogers taken at the Phoenix Rodeo.

In view of our editorial remarks last week against a proposed county high school system, we were interested to learn that Mr. Nodwell is an advocate of the consolidated public school system which is common in Texas, Arizona and California. He says: "One old timer in Texas told me the little red school-house is now a thing of the past, and no more asking one teacher to teach seven or eight grades. Wonder how the idea of a gym and auditorium combined with manual training and household science wings for a memorial is coming on? Georgetown surrounded as it is by the Glen, Norval, Limehouse and Stewarttown looks like an ideal site."

Continuing his trip up through Oregon and Washington to British Columbia, Mr. Nodwell plans to be back in Georgetown in September, in time for the centennial Fall Fair, and we hope he will have some of his travel photographs on display there in the Board of Trade booth.
