

## "What do you mean . . . I'm lucky?"

Lucky ladi Getting snagged on the wire in his effort to climb over a Hydro barrier ... probably to recover a ball ... may have saved his life. Some boys have not been so lucky.

Hydro energy is one of the finest things we have in Ontario to make for better living. But it can stop one from living, if you thoughtlessly give it a chance to flash through your body.
