Mildew Is Problem

To Be Found Anywhere Mildew is a problem likely to come up anywhere as the weather gets warmer, especially if there is

a long spell of rainy weather or damp muggy days. The economists say you can protect leather and imitation leather from mildew if you sponge it with a I per cent solution of thymol in alcohol. You can buy this solution at any drugstore. Test a small area of the leather where it will not show to be sure the solution will not change the color. The thymol solution will protect shoes and bags for two or three months, depending on how much the leather goods are handled or exposed to dampness. In some climates, when mildew appears on shoes, if you act promptly you can simply wash it off with a thick suds of mild pure soap or saddle soap. and wipe the shoes with a damp cloth. When the shoes are thoroughly dry, rub the leather with floor wax to keep off dampness and further mildew. Store the shoes where it is airy and dry, rather than in a dark closet. Follow the same precautions with leather bags, or other articles made of leather.

Companion Cropping

Makes Full Soil Use

In companion cropping, one grows two or more crops on soil at the same time, one usually a smallgrowing, quickly-maturing crop; the other requiring more space when full grown, and having a longer growing season. The smaller and earlier maturing crop is harvested before the other plants become crowded by it. The main crop then has the use of all the space until it matures. Examples of companion cropping are:

Transplanted lettuce plants alternating between early cabbage and cauliflower in the same row or be-

tween the rows. Carrot and radish seed grown together in the same row. The radishes will come up and break the ground for the carrot seed, and will be ready to pull before the young carrots are big enough to be crowded by them. Pulling the radishes also serves to thin the carrots to proper distances apart in the row, it is said.

Lettuce, spinach, early beets, kohlrabi, radishes, or early turnips may be planted between tomato, melon, squash or cucumber plants, and also between the rows.

Permanent Magnets

Permanent magnets are used most extensively in the fields of communication and measurement, but they have also found a great many additional and varied applications. In the home they are frequently employed in such time-saving devices as electric toasters, coffee percolators, ironing machines and electric refrigerators. Hearing aids and telephones, as well as many latches and locks, make use of them. Probably their biggest single application is in radio receivers, where much of the success of improved quality of sound and tone is the result of improved magnets. In industry, where magnets are used in both control and power equipment, they are found in ignition magnetos, many small motors, meters and instruments and numerous other devices.

Money in Ashes If paper currency is burned to such an extent that nothing but a powdered ash remains, no redemption can be made, for in that condition it is impossible to identify the notes involved as to denomination, kind and genuineness. Only when fragments of notes sufficiently large to show part of the engraved face design of the note have been salvaged can redemption be accomplished.

If ashes contain such fragments they should be forwarded to the treasury department, addressed as follows: Treasurer of the United States, Currency Redemption Division, Washington, D. C.

Milk Stain

Milk is difficult to get out of cloth if the article is put into soapy water first. If rinsed first in clear, cold water the stiffness that is sometimes left in cloth from the laundry will be avoided. If the milk stain is old and dry, it will be necessary to soak in the cold water until it is thoroughly moist. Rub lightly before removing from the cold water. The calcium in milk will form a curd with the soap just as some socalled "hard water" forms a white curd when soap is put into it. Infants and small children's clothing and table linens are the articles most apt to have milk stains.

Energy Food -Honey is a great energy food.

Seventy-five to eighty per cent of its composition is sugars. The simple sugars, dextrose and levulose, make up almost the entire sugar content of honey. It has been clinically demonstrated that little digestion is necessary and that absorption takes place quickly. In addition to its sugars honey contains as its minor components, a considerable number of mineral constituents, seven members of the B vitamin complex, ascorbic acid (vitamin C), dextrins. plant pigments, amino acids and other organic acids, traces of protein. esters and other aromatic compounds, and several enzymes.
