HALTON BREEDERS SUPPLY CATTLE FOR BRITISH SOCIETY

A four man delegation representing the British Friesian Cattle Society has just purchased 220 head of Canadian Holsteins at a cost of over half a million dollars. The average price paid the Canadian breeders was \$2037, which, with handling and transportation costs will increase to approximately \$2,300, delivered in Great Britain. The shipment was selected from the provinces of Ontario, Quebec, Manitoba, and Alberta, and will go to breeders in all parts of Great Britain.

Halton breeders supplied seven head all of them high class individuals. Two bulls came from Harold Bingham, Georgetown, and two open daughters of the noted twice All-Canadian Motivic Rag Apple Sovereign from John Pickett, Hornby. A top-notch bred heifer was contributed by E. J. Meagher, Oakville, an open heifer by Ross Segsworth, Freeman and a bull calf by Max Greenberg, Freeman.
