by G. H. Brown Trout In a recent issue of the Globe and Mail some very interesting fishing news was noticed, along with a very fine picture of the fish. - Namely a 6 lb. 12 oz. Brown Trout 24" long. caught by a Harvey Isherwood at Williams' Lake near Owen Sound. The lure he used was a self made one with dew worm attached. The rod was a Youth 16 to 18 years of age for 4 oz. fly rod. This was a very fine machine shop work. Apply - Harley- specimen and a record for the lake. Of course it was a typical Williams'. Lake fish. Brown trout were not caught there until about 2 years ago. The speckled trout in the lake are also unusual specimens. The reason for this is of course, the abundance of feed and condition of the water. The av erage depth of the lake is 20 to 25 feet Spring holes are found mostly along

> about 30 feet to 75 feet. The best placest to fish are just off these holes. It one knows the landmarks well enough so he can anchor on the bars between these holes, he is sure to get fish. Of course one has to have the patience to sit it out. Minnows and worms are the baits used mostly. They can be taken on a fly but one has to

one shore. These vary in depth from

deep water.
