COUNCIL HOLD TWO SPECIAL SESSIONS

War-time Housing is taking up much of the time of local councillors these days. A special meeting had to be called on Monday evening to deal with the grading and road work at the housing project, and again on Tuesday afternoon the council conferred with the engineer on the property. In the absence of Mayor Cleave, Reeve MacDonald took the chair.
 Work is now progressing on the war-time houses, and a steam shovel is busy excavating for the foundations. At least ten have been excavated to date. Workshops for the construction of the framework have also been set up on the grounds and lumber and building supplies are arriving daily. The George Construction Co. of Toronto are the contractors, and local concrete firms will erect the foundations.

A bulldozer will be in this week to lay out the roadway and grade the land to specifications. It is expected that ten houses will be ready by December for occupancy.
