In 1945 he was appointed Trade and Industrial Commissioner at Ontario House London, where he remained until his transfer to this Department The business of the Trade and Industry Branch of the Department of Planning and Development has greatly increased. tion distributed in this way. The Branch is now in a position to render service to manufacturers and traders in facilitating and developing export and import business. It will continue to foster and assist the establishment of industries. It maintains contact with all organizations engaged in allied work such as the Department of Trade and Commerce, the Chartered Banks, industrial commissions, Boards of Trade, Chambers of Commerce, the Manufacturers Association, the Importers and Exporters Associations. It maintain and develops contacts outside the country. It gathers comprehensive industrial statistics to provide service to businessmen and to guide the government in any policies tha may affect industry.


