The Victory International Plowing Match, held in Huron County, October 15 to 16 inclusive, broke all past records from the standpoint of tractor plowmen and general attendance. Notwithstanding . somewhat unfavorable weather conditions the Port Albert (Airfield the scene of the 1946 event, was the mecca for rural Ontario. According to reports all highways in the area were congested and traffic had to move at a snail's pace for a distance of 12 to 15 miles from headquarters in all directions.
