PLAY BY ATHOL STEWART
PRODUCED ON CBC NETWORK

A book written while the author was on active service with the Canadian army in Holland formed the basis for a half-hour play produced by Robert Allen on the CBC network at 2.30 p.m. last Tuesday, November 12th. The author was a Georgetown man by "adoption", Athol Stewart, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. M. Stewart who bought and moved to their home at Wildwood on the edge of town while he was overseas.

Capt. Stewart served with the Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry Highlanders, landed in France on "D" Day and saw action through the bitter fighting to Boulogne. His book, called "The Valley" was turned down by publishers who didn't want war stories after war's end, but its subject matter interested the CBC and the radio play resulted.
The broadcast was from station CHOI in Montreal and was heard in Georgetown over station CBL, Toronto.
