CHEROKEE RODEO FIRST CLASS SHOW BUT DRAWS SMALL CROWDS

Attendance figures were disappointing when the Cherokee Rodeo Company played a three night engagement under sponsorship of the Georgetown Lions Club. The show, which had attracted 4500 customers in Palmerston a few weeks ago, played to a total of 1427 here. Biggest night was Friday with 561 and on Thursday there were 400 and Saturday, 467. Financially, while the rodeo company would find it hard to meet expenses, the Club did all right. The contract called for a 40 per cent share of the gross receipts for the club, with the Lions paying expenses of renting hall and advertising. The Lions will net about \$170 up the final tally.

The rodeo was a snappy, two-hour show, filled with all the ingredients of good entertainment. There was no lag once the parade of stars was announced over the loudspeaker. There were exhibitions of bronco and steer riding, dancing horses and jumping, including one rider who took the jump standing with one foot on each mount. There were a couple of lasso experts who did the seemingly impossible, and a young lady who snipped paper from a clown's mouth with an Australian bull-whip.

Spotted throughout the show was a clown with a comical pair of donkeys, who did their tricks better even than the horses. A lot of laughter was provided by the little donkey who refused to let a number of local lads up on his back. Grand finale was individual exhibitions of really fancy riding by the several men and women who comprised the cast. They came mostly from the western states — New Mexico, Nevada and Texas, though one girl hailed from Regina and one of the men who had joined only a few days before was from Toronto.

Only mishap was on Friday night when a lady rider suffered a broken nose in a fall. She was attended by Dr. C. V. Williams. The rodeo has moved on to Listowel and it is to be
