

Fire This Morning Damages McNally Wood Products

A fire this morning shortly after eight o'clock did considerable damage to the shop of McNally Wood Products at the corner of Market and William Streets. Believed to have been caused by an overheated stove, there was no one in the building at the time. The fire was noticed immediately by neighbours and by Mr. McNally and his brother-in-law Paul Barber who were having breakfast at Fred McNally's just across the road. The fire brigade, which answered the call in record time did a wonderful job of averting what could have been a complete loss. As it was, the building proper was practically destroyed and a quantity of plywood and a number of hand tools lost. The heating machinery, while suffering some water damage, was not permanently damaged.

FREDERICK ARTHUR JOHNSON DIES IN MALTON CONVALESCENT HOSPITAL

A resident of Georgetown for the past twenty-three years, Frederick Arthur Johnson passed away at the Malton Convalescent Hospital on November 24, after being in ill health for the past few years.

He was born in Meaford, Ontario in the year 1883 and lived there until his enlistment in the army for the First World War, in which he served overseas until 1918.
