**G.R.C. Will Have
Open-air Rink in Park**

For the first time in several years Georgetown will have an open air rink. Because of the impossibility of working all the bantam, midget and juvenile hockey teams into the Arena schedule, the Recreational Council has decided to construct a rink at the park across from the armouries. At present enough boys have signed up for hockey to make three juvenile teams, five midget and four bantam, with indications that these might be increased before the season gets underway.

Details of the hockey program were worked out at a meeting of the Council last Tuesday, when Alf Sykes, Mervin Robb and Roy "Bungy" Ward were appointed as a Hockey Committee. The open air rink committee is composed of Bruce Mackenzie, Don Barrager, Mervin Robb and director Hal Newman.

This year the Council has decided to let the lads supply their own hockey sticks, as there is considerable wastage and unnecessary expenditure of G. R. C. funds when sticks are supplied. Recreational Councils in Brampton and Acton have already been enquiring about arranging matches between town teams, and it looks like a full season of hockey for everyone, with the hockey Club sponsoring both junior and intermediate teams.

It was reported at the meeting that the G.R.C. has been granted use of the armouries on Monday and Wednesday evenings for sports activities which cannot be carried on in the present quarters in the Old Town Hall. A discussion took place on renting the Hall for outside activities and a motion was passed that "The Hall be kept purely for recreational activities."

A membership campaign to enlist support, both morally and financially, is getting underway and \$1 memberships are being sold. After the Christmas season, a renewed drive will be made to reach the 1000 membership mark.

A report of the play staged by Apprentice Productions under G.R.C. sponsorship showed a good profit for both groups. Most of the money had been put into stage settings and improvements to the hall.
