LETTER TO THE EDITOR

R. R. I. Norval, Ont.

Dear Mr. Editor:

In your editorial in a recent edition of the Herald concerning the High School District your main worry seemed to be the cost of this undertaking. quote "If the new high school were to cost more than to continue the present three schools with their needed improvements then we should say there was no good reason for a change. If consolidation could mean a saving to the public treasury, then we should say "go ahead." unquote. I should like to point out that costs should not be the only consideration because (1) costs will increase in any case when a building programme is necessary throughout the entire county. (2) If a High School district is formed an increase in Provincial Grants will help offset the increase in local cost. I would like to say here that the government will pay a guaranteed 50 per cent of all costs and a probable 75 per cent of transportation costs. (3) In return for and additional expenditures rural pupils will be transported and will enjoy as nearly as possible the same privileges as an urban child. No country child will have more than a mile to go to meet the bus. Since the people of Trafalgar know that consolidation will take effect on January 1, 1947, 100 per cent of last year's entrance pupils are now attending high school. (4) A more interesting and varied High School Programme should result in a better and more beneficial type of education for all pupils, and a larger attendance. We would like you to note that the attendance in G.H.S. dwindles from approximately 80 pupils in first form to an even dozen in fifth form. If G.H.S. was giving the pupils adequate education would this happen?

The whole idea of this programme is to provide a better and more varied system of education for all pupils — not to save money for the public treasury.

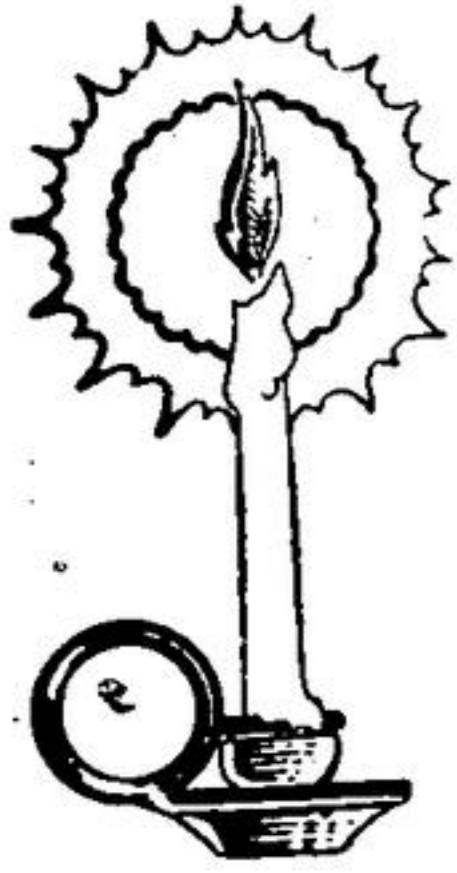

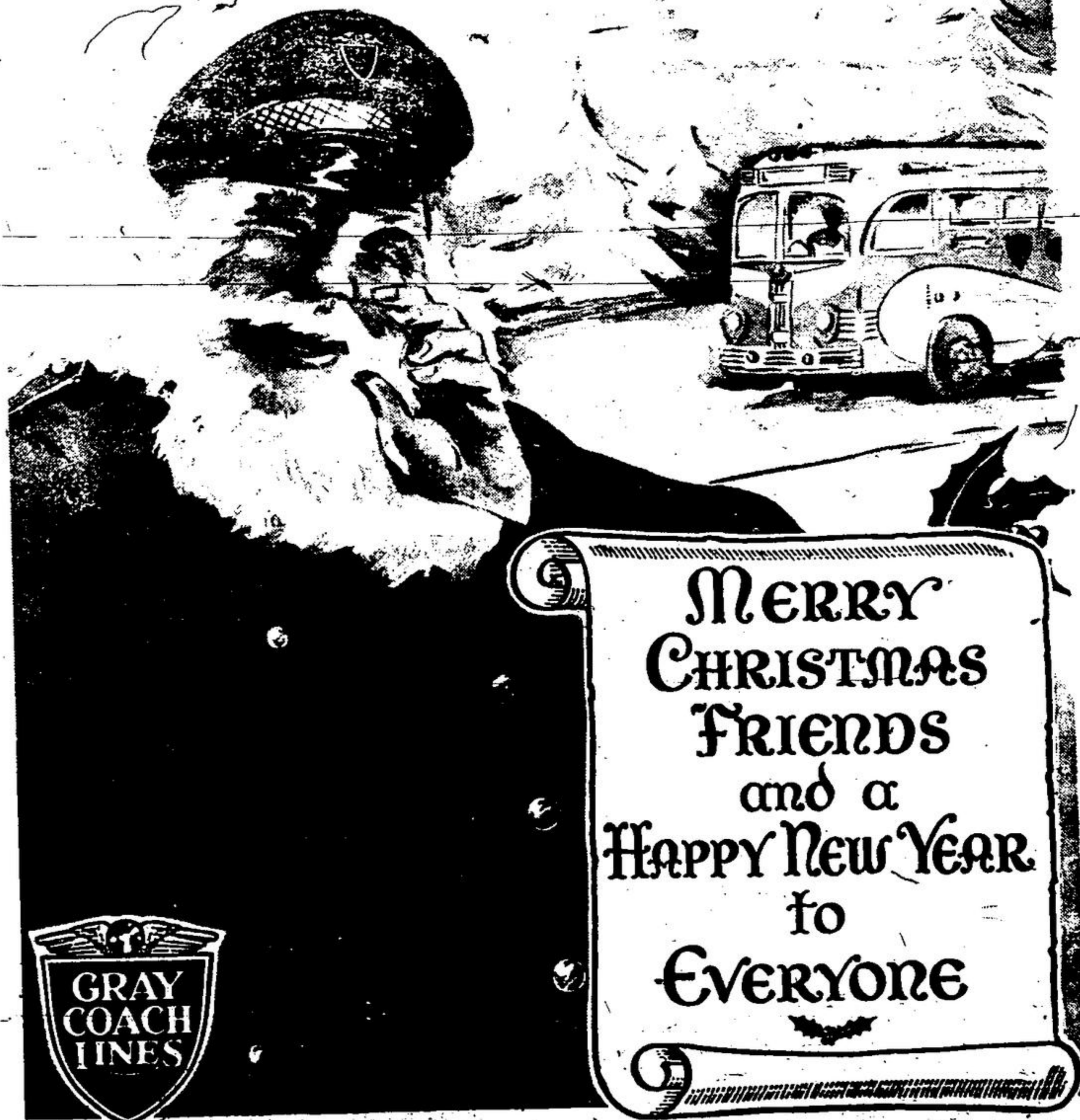
