It was certainly the most exciting hockey Georgetown has seen this season last Friday, even if Stratford was somewhat swamped by a superior Georgetown team. The Stratford lads play a rough and ready brand of hockey and while they lacked scoring punch, gave a much better account of themselves than the lop-sided score indicates.

Smith Trophy, and a composite team from the Midget league will play a group of Acton midget all-stars. Both teams will appear under the sponsorship of the O.R.C.

Hespeler didn't get any farther in the OMHA Juvenile play-downs and after putting Georgetown out in a sudden-death game here, they were ousted by Elmira in the next round.

Orangeville had little trouble eliminating Fergus in two straight games and Acton handily took Elora in the Group 5 Intermediate "B" semi-finals. We're calling Acton to win the group, though we hear Orangeville has been bolstered with some "imports." First game was to have been in Acton Monday night, but the storm forced postponement.
