**Twelfth Annual Halton Seed Fair
And Third Annual Bacon Show
Offers Outstanding Program**

The annual prize list for the annual Halton Seed Fair and Bacon Show which has recently been distributed, reveals an excellent prize-list for both sections of the show and an outstanding programme. The event is scheduled for the Milton Town Hall on Friday and Saturday, March 14 and 15. We understand from C. L. S. Palmer of Freeman, President of the Halton Crop Improvement Association that all entries and exhibits will be received on Friday morning with the judging taking place the same afternoon. The Seed Fair, this year, has a new feature in the form of a special Junior Farmer Section, with classes in Oats, Barley and Winter Wheat. Halton Junior Farmers are offering a \$10.00 special to the Junior Farmer Group getting out the largest number of exhibits from their respective members. The achievement day for the members of the two boys' grain clubs organized in 1946 is also being held at this event.

Halton Hog Producers' Ass'n. under the leadership of President R. Bruce Reid, Georgetown, and his fellow officers have secured an excellent entry for the Bacon Show. No less than 45 Halton hog producers have each entered a hog for this show. These have already been marketed and are being processed into Wiltshires, a portion of which will be on display at the Milton Town Hall on Saturday afternoon. The prize-list money for this section is being provided by the Federal Live-Stock Branch, the officers of which with the cooperation of Canada Packers Limited are selecting the sides and bringing the display to Milton.

Primarily the Halton Seed Fair is a commercial show and only those with seed for sale, are eligible. Furthermore, the grain and seed exhibited must be of the same quality and grade as that being offered for sale, consequently provides an excellent opportunity for sellers and buyers to get together. Incidentally there is an auction sale of ten bushel lots of both oats and barley at 4.00 p.m. on Saturday.

Registration takes place at the Milton Town Hall at 9.00 p.m.

Notwithstanding blocked roads in some sections of the county, officials of the two sponsoring organizations are predicting another packed hall at Milton on Saturday afternoon for this most popular and largest attended of any annual farm gathering held in Halton.
