Lions Grant Use of Club Lot for Parking Project

Georgetown Lions Club, at their dinner meeting in the McMillan House on Monday, granted the Board of Trade the use of the club-owned lot on Water Street for a three-year period to become part of the proposed municipal parking arena. President Arthur Speight of the Board of Trade was at the meeting and again outlined the plan, which includes the Lions lot as an entrance area through which buses would be routed and cars could enter the parking area.

Lion Chief Ab Toot was in the chair, and read a letter from a group of citizens who suggested that former Police Chief W. G. Marshall be hired as town foreman. They asked the club, if favourable, to endorse a letter and send this to the Council requesting this. Several members spoke, feeling that it was not within the jurisdiction of the club to pass on such matters and that it was a decision which members should deal with as individuals.

A suggestion by Lion Jas. Ballantine that the lot be given to the town for erection of a band stand, with a basement below to contain property owned by the club found some favour, but was voted down in favour of the parking project.

Mr. A. L. Bouck was introduced as a guest at the meeting, and membership pins were presented by Lions Ballantine and Harold McClure to new members Ed. Martin and Frank Martin.

Ladies Night was set for the first Monday in May. Members were urged to attend the district oratorical finals in Kitchener on April 18th, when Ernest West of Aston, sponsored by the Club, will compete in the contest. An appeal from the Oakville Lions was received for their "Timmy" fund for crippled children.

- The Council of the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown intends to install a sewerage system, part of which will be undertaken as a Local Improvement and intends to specially assess a part of the cost upon the land abutting directly on the work. Particulars of the land affected can be obtained from the Municipal Clerk.
- The estimated cost of the work is \$333,221.06, of which \$164,000.00 is to be paid by the Corporation. The estimated cost per foot frontage is \$1.68. The special assessment is to be paid in twenty annual instalments.
- A petition to the said council will not avail to prevent its construction, but a petition against the work or the manner in which it has been undertaken, may be made pursuant to Section 10 of The Local Improvement Act, to the Ontario Municipal Board, by a majority of the owners representing at least one-half of the value of the lots which are to be specially assessed therefor.
- A by-law for undertaking the work will be considered by the council at a meeting thereof to be held on the 5th day of May, 1947, or at a regular or special meeting thereof to be held thereafter.
