The Council of the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown intends to install a sewerage system, part of which will be undertaken as a Local Improvement and intends to specially assess a part of the cost upon the land abutting directly on the work. Particulars of the land affected can be obtained from the Municipal Clerk.

2. The estimated cost of the work is \$360,165.76, of which \$226,540.00 is to be paid by the Corporation. The estimated cost per foot frontage is \$1.69. The special assessment is to be paid in twenty annual instalments.

3. A petition to the said council will not avail to prevent its construction, but a petition against the work or the manner in which it has been undertaken, may be made pursuant to Section 10 of The Local Improvement Act, to the Ontario Municipal Board, by a majority of the owners representing at least one-half of the value of the lots which are to be specially assessed therefor.

4. A by-law for undertaking the work will be considered by the council at a meeting thereof to be held on the 5th day of May, 1947, or at a regular or special meeting thereof to be held thereafter.
