District Cattle Included in Shipment to China

A shipment of 200 grade Holstein heifers and 40 purebred Holstein bulls has been arranged to China through U.N.R.R.A. These animals have been selected from Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick and the Western Canada provinces and left Vancouver on April 12th. They are designed as seed stock for Chinese farms and will go to Experimental Farms and Agricultural Colleges in the vicinity of Shanghai.

The 40 purebred bulls are high-class individuals carrying the best blood lines in Canada. They include sons of such noted sires as the twice All-Canadian Montvic Bag Apple Sovereign, Montvic Commander, Eays' Engweden Poeh, the All-Canadian Potions Monogram, Montvic Elmsie Piejke Poeh, son of the famous \$21,000 Montvic Bonheur Piejke B.; Sonawick Sovereign, Grand Champion at the Eastern Ontario Championship Show last year; Lonelm Tonal Payne on whose blood the Maple Artificial breeding unit, largest in Canada is being built; and Glenafion Control and Paul Tonal Bag Apple, sons of the four times All-Canadian Extra bull Montvic Bag Apple Masterman.

The bulls being shipped are from one to two years old and in each case have had either five paternal sisters with mature records of at least 500 lbs. fat or the equivalent at a younger age; or the three nearest dams with records of at least 500 lbs. fat. Arrangements for this shipment were made through the Canadian Export Corporation, Montreal, who worked with the Dominion Departments of Trade and Commerce and Agriculture. Actual purchase of the animals was made by Wm. J. Murphy, Lindsay, assisted by Frank Dolson, Brantford.

Animals purchased locally for this shipment included, Fordholm Poeh Simon from Emerson Ford, Hornby, and a son of Card Farm Baron Bess Ormsby secured from Wm. Reid, Norval.

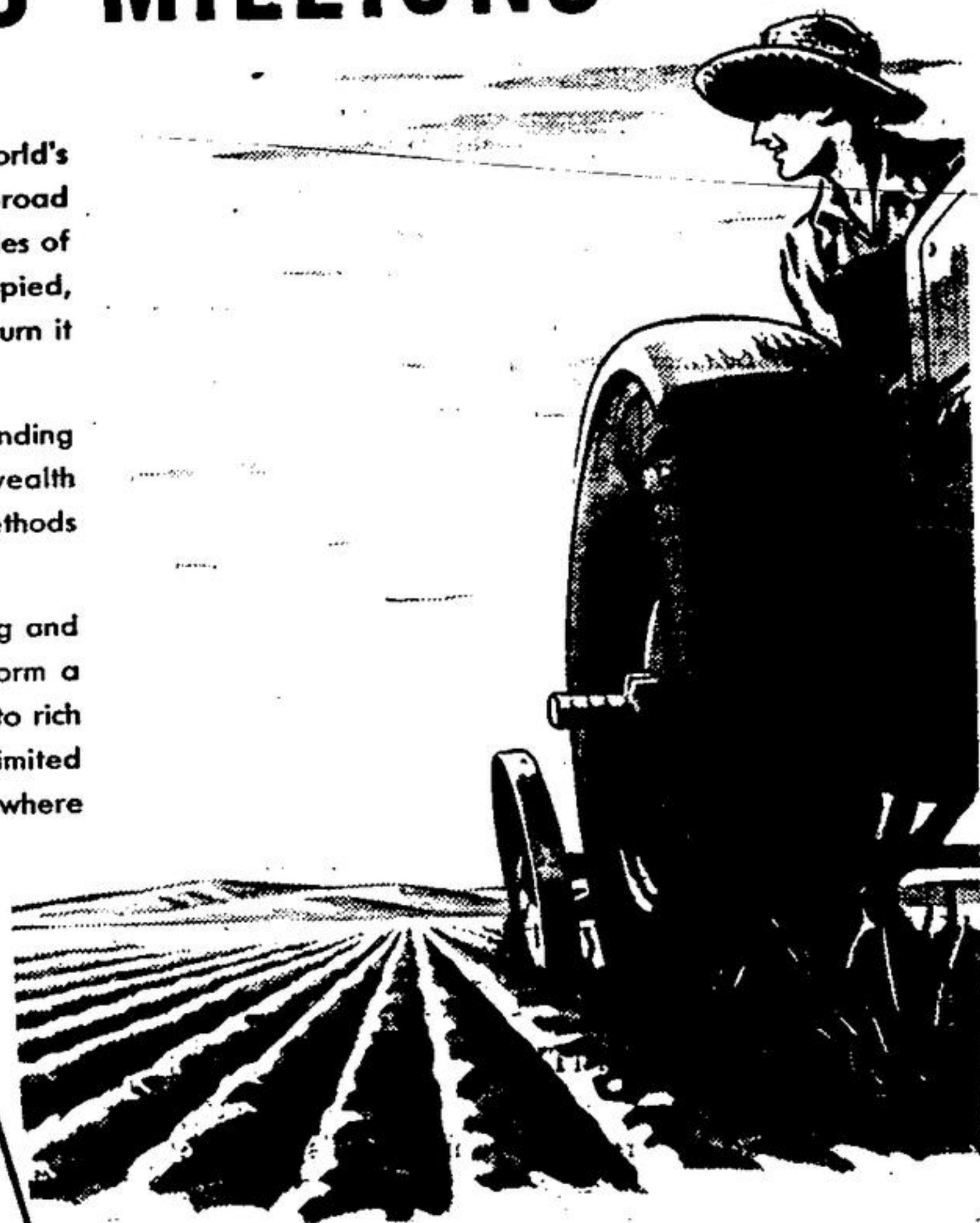
