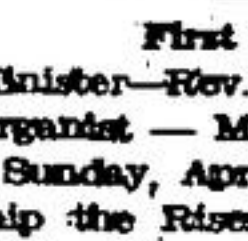

What County Council Did ON TUESDAY, APRIL 15

—Appointed E. M. Roadstead, Lowville as county weed inspector at a salary of \$6 a day and a grant of \$100 travelling expenses.
 —Granted \$500 to the Lorne Scots Regiment and \$500 to the Lorne Scots Band.
 —Increased salaries of Councilmembers to \$500 yearly for the Warden and \$7 per meeting for members with mileage at 10c a mile. Increase to be effective January 1st, 1947.
 —Increased the treasurer's salary to \$1850 and the clerk's to \$1650, effective January 1st.
 —Approved a by-law respecting tree cutting in the county. Excepting an occupant of land who may cut trees for his own use, it prohibits cutting cedars less than seven inches and other trees less than 14 inches in diameter. No trees may be cut within 66 feet width of the road allowance unless approved by the Trees Commission. A fine up to \$500 or three months' imprisonment is provided for violations. A three-man Trees Commission will be set up, with members paid \$1 an hour plus a 5c mileage allowance.

—Decided to invite representative pupils from each elementary school in the County to the May 13th County Council meeting.
 —Argued the advisability of advancing \$400 to County Engineer Roy Smith for purchasing a new car, the loan to be paid by the end of the year. The motion was first approved, with only four dissenting votes, then Reeve Alex MacLaren of Georgetown presented a motion asking the order be rescinded. Deputy-Reeve George Currie of Esquesing sided with him, saying that if the loan went through any ratepayer could expect the same consideration and the Council was not in the loan business. The matter will be settled at the next meeting.

OVERSEAS CHAPLAIN CALLED TO ACTON CHURCH

Captain the Reverend John M. Anderson, M.C. and Bar, has been called to Knox Presbyterian Church, Acton, and will be inducted tomorrow night. He succeeds Rev. Forbes Thomson, now of MacNab Street Church, Hamilton. Capt. Anderson, a graduate of the University of Western Ontario and Knox College, served as a chaplain overseas with the Highland Light Infantry of Canada.

Rev. Fred Williamson, who has been supplying the pulpits of St. Paul's Church, Guelph and Eden Mills and Rockwood Churches, has received a call from these churches. His induction service takes place in Rockwood next Tuesday. He succeeds Dr. W. J. McIvor, who is now in Ireland.
