Art Scott is Youngest General Motors Dealer

Well-known in the vicinity and prominent Georgetown garage man in this district for the past ten years, Art Scott has been given the General Motors agency for Chevrolet, Oldsmobile and Chevrolet trucks in Georgetown and district. He has the distinction of being the youngest G.M.O. dealer in Ontario.

Born in Limehouse, Art is a son of Mrs. John R. Scott of Georgetown and the late Mr. Scott, and member of a pioneer Limehouse family. He started in business with a trucking business which was operated from Glen Williams and ten years ago leased the garage at the Main & Guelph Street corner where he has carried on a successful automotive business since. Two years ago he purchased the trucking business of Charles Parker and has since been operating the C.N.E. cartage and freight in conjunction with the garage.

During the war years, Art operated the Malton bus which took dozens of war-workers from Georgetown to their jobs at Victory Aircraft in Malton. At present he operates a similar service for the Smith & Stone plant in town, bringing employees from the outlying communities to their daily employment at this plant. Until the town purchased the snow plow to operate municipally this winter, he did a good job of plowing the streets for the past few winters.

Art is married to the former Myrtle Kirby of Glen Williams and they have three children, Sandra, Karen and John. His interests in community life included membership in Orion Lodge, I.O.O.F., the Lions Club, of which he is second vice-president, Knox Presbyterian Church and the Halton Garage Operators Association.

Last previous General Motors dealer in town was John N. O'Neill, who had a similar agency several years ago in his garage on Main Street which now is known as the Dugies Building. For the time being, Art will operate from his present business location, but plans are underway for the construction of a new building on the site of the B-A Service Station at Queen and Guelph Streets, and this motor sales will be in their new location sometime this year.
