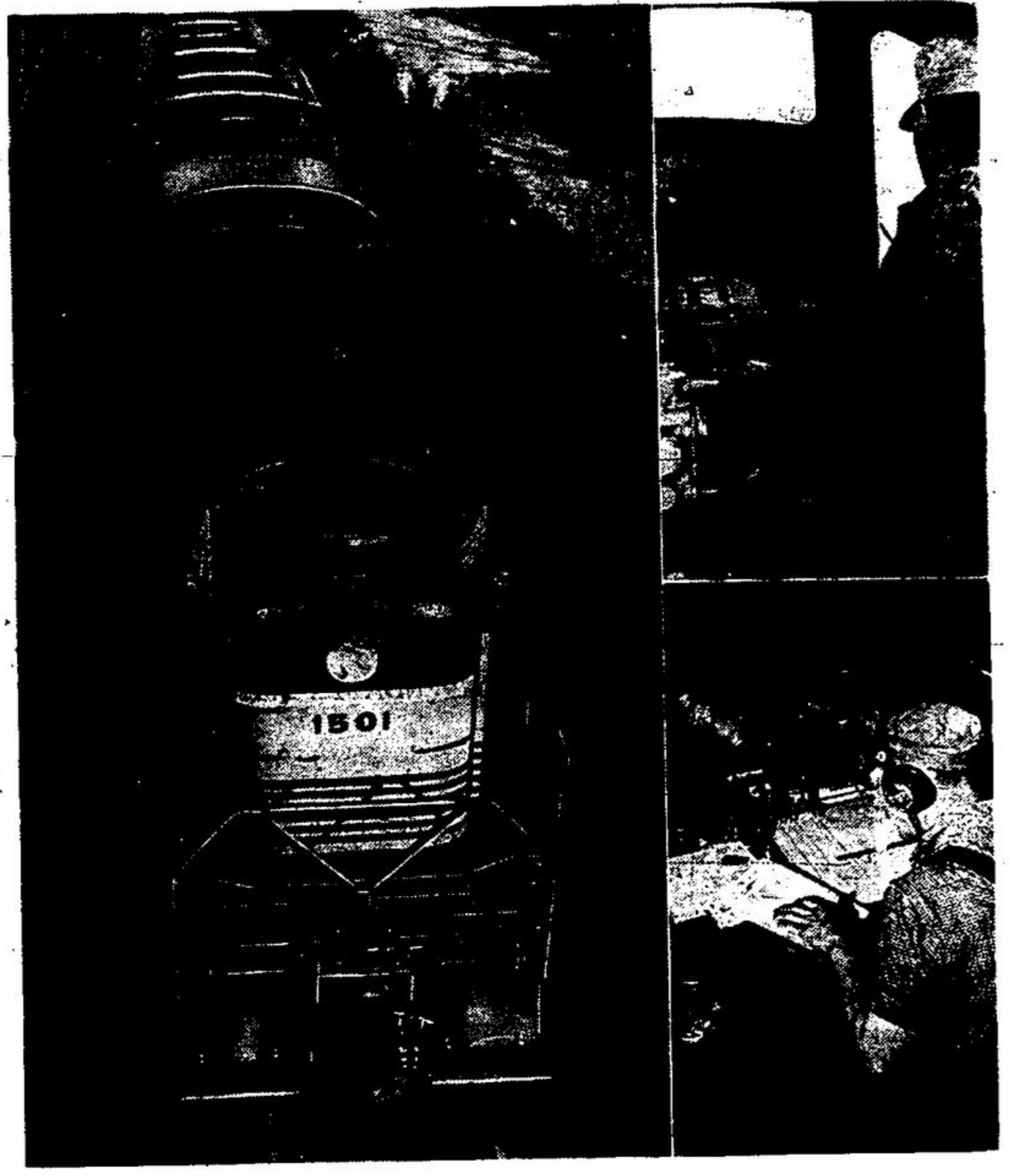

IMPORTANT POWER TEST: Road tests now being carried out by the Canadian Pacific Railway with diesel-electric locomotive 1501 if successful may revolutionize rail motive power in the Dominion. In this layout (left), the engine is leaving the Furber, Que., yards on its first test hauling 40 loaded box cars, with Engineer N. Roy (top right) at the throttle in the spotless cab, while Operator W. B. Patterson (bottom right) works at the chronograph table of the C.P.R.'s dynamometer car, only one of its type in North America. This car, designed by Canadian Pacific technicians, gives a complete picture of the performance of any locomotive through a complex system of dials and automatic recorders. Following exhaustive tests on the heavy-traffic Furber division, 1501 will run on the level Winchester subdivision of the Montreal-Toronto main line and on the curves and grades of the Laurentian division.
