The Canadian National Institute is the Agency which lights the lamp for those who will be in the world of darkness caused by loss of vision. It is the only Agency in Canada that is structive services to significan people: The training and employment of employable blind people; the use of a touch type library service; the provision of a sales room service, which enables blind people to purchase raw materials in the making of handicrafts, and to dispose of the finished articles; advice and financial assistance where necessary; as well as host of other services all of which are freely available to blind people.
