Tag Day For Blind Next Saturday

On Saturday, May 3rd, the annual tag day on behalf of the Canadian National Institute for the Blind will be held in Georgetown under the sponsorship of The Imperial Order of the Daughters of the Empire.

This will be the only appeal made on behalf of sightless people during the year. It will be the one occasion upon which the citizens will be given the opportunity of expressing their appreciation of the precious gift of sight, by contributing to the Organization which provides services to the less fortunate.

The Canadian National Institute is the Agency which lights the lamp for those who will be in the world of darkness caused by loss of vision. It is the only Agency in Canada that is equipped to render the following constructive services to sightless people: The training and employment of employable blind people; the use of a touch type library service; the provision of a sales room service, which enables blind people to purchase raw materials in the making of hand-crafts, and to dispose of the finished articles; advice and financial assistance where necessary; as well as a host of other services all of which are freely available to blind people.

The value of the service program outlined above may not be valued in dollars and cents, but dollars and cents are vital to its maintenance, and the citizens of Georgetown may share in its maintenance by contributing to the tag day or by forwarding a donation to the tag day convenor, Mrs. Victor Diggins.
