".1. We deplore weddings, the settings of which makes them publicity stunts, thereby demeaning the marriage ceremony and destroving its solemnity.

2. We call upon the Provincial Government to enact legislation requir-(a) pre-marital examination (health), particularly the seriological test for syphilis (b) that the issuing of a marriage ilcense be granted only on the satisfying of these health requirements.

3 We request the Provincial Government to make provision for the performance of civil marriages in the Province, so as to relieve ministers of any obligation to participate in marrage proceedings which are not in accordance with the teachings of the Church; also to avoid the necessity of persons not desiring Christian marriage with its obligations participating in such vows and declarations as the Church requires.

It is recognized that in regard to divorce, it is better to try to prevent circumstances arising which lead divorce than to stress reformation.
