MRS. HERBERT ERWIN  
TAKEN BY DEATH

A well-known resident of Georgetown, Mrs. Herbert Erwin passed away at her home on Victoria Street on Wednesday, April 30th. Due to a rheumatic condition, Mrs. Erwin had been an invalid for several years and had not been able to leave her home. She was born Margaret McDonald in Requesing Township 72 years ago and moved to Georgetown when a girl with her parents, the late Alexander McDonald and Elizabeth Burnside.

In 1900, she married Herbert Erwin, who predeceased her in 1936. She was a member of Georgetown United Church and a life member of the Women's Missionary Society of the church. Surviving are two daughters Hilda and Mrs. Armand Swackhamer (Madeleine). She leaves one sister, Mrs. R. C. Adams (Maude) of Georgetown, and three brothers, Charles of Detroit, Michigan, Graham of Toronto and Victor of Georgetown.

Rev. R. C. Todd conducted a private funeral service at the home on Friday afternoon. Pall-bearers were Roy King, Harry Goldman, Frank Russell, and three nephews, Ken MacDonald, James Erwin, Toronto, and Jack Morrow, Brampton. Interment was in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown.
