#### Township Council Awards 1947 Gravel Contract

All members were present and Reserve George Cleave presided at the regular Esquesing Council meeting in Stewarttown on Monday. The clerk was instructed to prepare a by-law setting the salary of the road superintendent at \$1400 a year with \$26 monthly car allowance and 7c a mile when using his car on township business outside the township.

A one-fifth mill will be levied on all ratepayers assessed as farmers for the Federation of Agriculture. Spencer Wilson, sheep valuator, was paid \$4 for one trip, and expenses for funeral services for an indigent of \$30 were paid. Other accounts included: Roads, \$1434.04; Relief, \$58.45; charity accounts from Prov. of Sask. and Ontario Hospital, Woodstock, \$65.
