At the opening practice of Norval's Juvenile and Junior lacrosse teams last Thursday, crests were presented to last year's midget team which lost out in the semi-finals to St. John's Toronto. The presentations were made by Jim Clark, team coach, who this year will have charge of the Juvenile (under 18) and Junior (under 20) entries. Norval has decided this year to drop out of the Bush League. With Brampton planning an Intermediate O.L.A. entry, it is felt that Norval cannot field a good enough team minus the Brampton lads who would be playing bush league for Norval. Instead, Norval will concentrate on a Junior team which will have a much more local flavour. The age limit has been dropped a year and eligible juniors must be under 20 as of January 1st this year. Norval representatives including Frank Pendley, Jim Clark and Rev. J. L. Self attended an O.L.A. meeting in Toronto Monday and twelve junior teams have been entered this year: Norval, Caledon, Orangeville, Mimico, Brampton, Long Branch, Fergus, Owen Sound, Orillia, Dundas, St. Catharines and St. Vincent's, Toronto. Just how the league will operate is not yet known until schedules are drawn up on June 1st.

The Bush League this year expects to see entries from Caledon East, Inglewood, Cheltenham, Caledon and Nortonville, with Streetsville another possibility.
