Robert Blyth Was Active In Glen Church Work
 An active member of the congregation of Glen Williams United Church during his residence in the district, Robert W. Blyth passed away in Ouelph General Hospital on Sunday, May 18th, following an operation. Mr. Blyth was born in Norfolk, England, in 1889. With his wife, formerly Selma Armstrong, he came to Canada in 1913, and took up farming near St. George, Ontario. In 1926 he came to the Glen Williams district and farmed there until last year, when with his son Horace, he moved to Nassagaweya Township to establish a farm. Mr. Blyth had been superintendent of the Sunday School and teacher of the Bible class in Glen Williams United Church for several years. Prior to that he had attended Terra Cotta United Church, where he also served as Sunday School superintendent, and often conducted the church service. Since moving to Nassagaweya, he had attended Ebenezer Church. He was a Past Grand Master of the Glen Orange Lodge and a member of the Black Knights.
 Surviving besides his wife are four children, Mrs. William Gibbs, (Elsie), Mrs. Phyllis Doherty and George, all of Georgetown, and Horace, R. R. 1, Acton. He also leaves two brothers, George and James, and three sisters, Mrs. Victor Vardigans (Emma), Mrs. Albert Richardson (Rosie) and Mrs. Arthur Mickleborough (Eva), all in England. There are seven grandchildren.
 The funeral was held from the home of his son, George Blyth, to Georgetown United Church last Tuesday. Rev. R. W. Pickersgill and Rev. R. C. Todd conducted the service and interment was made in Glen Williams Cemetery. Pall-bearers were William Schenk, Howard Garvin, Cecil Barth, Alvin Starret, Alfred Allen and George Inglis.
