Mrs. Walter Parsons Dies Suddenly in Guelph

It was a great shock to her friends to learn of the death of Mrs. Walter Parsons in Guelph General Hospital last Thursday morning. Mrs. Parsons had been convalescing from a cracked hip bone. The injury was received when she fell on Mill Street on her way to church a week ago Sunday. Mrs. Parsons had been making a favourable recovery and her sudden death was caused by a blood clot.

She was born Ellen Davies in Somersetshire, Hants, England, seventy years ago, and came with her husband to Canada in 1904. They settled first at Ashgrove and moved to Georgetown three years later. Her husband passed away on November 24th,

1941, after a lengthy illness. For the past few years, Mrs. Parsons had been caretaker of the Public Library. After her husband's death, she sold their home on Factory Street to Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Smith and had been making her home with Mrs. W. D. Johnston, Charles Street.

A member of St. George's Church of England, she had belonged to the Women's Auxiliary and had at one time assisted her husband with his duties as sexton. There are no surviving relatives. Funeral services were conducted from the McClure Funeral Home on Saturday to St. George's Church, where Archdeacon W. G. O. Thompson conducted the service. Pall bearers were Thomas Elson, James Patton, Fred McNally, Kenneth M. Langdon, R. R. McKibbin and Chris Sargent. Interment was in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown.

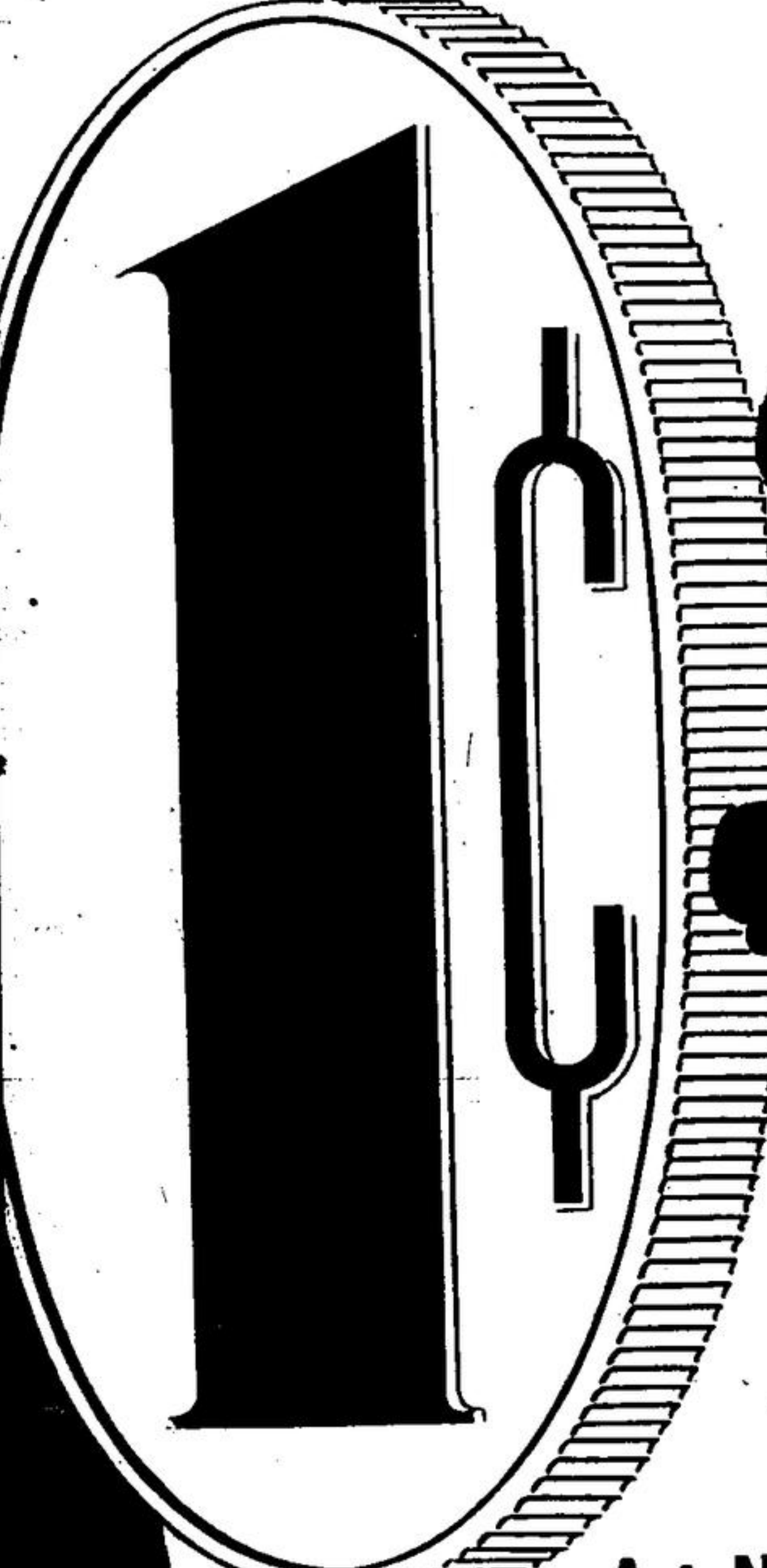
