The Robin Hood Flour Mill on the bank of the Welland Canal to which a new million dollar unit has been added to mill cake and pastry flour from Ontario soft wheat.

A new million-dollar unit has been added to the Robin Hood Flour Mill at Humberstone, Ontario. Designed to use only Ontario soft wheat, it will produce a fine cake and pastry flour which is to reach the market under the trade name "VELVET".

The new mill is completely equipped from top to bottom with the most up-to-date machinery obtainable. An air conditioning unit provides a change of air every ten minutes and, in addition, controls both temperature and humidity. The milling of wheat into cake flour uses a special technique and in the process the flour travels upward of two miles through the elaborate process.
