WITH THE ANGLERS

OK. Everybody can uncross their fingers. We've had it — the perfect week end.

Dry and Wet

Many fishermen ask: "What is the difference between a dry fly and a wet one?" Most wet flies are made sparsely on heavy wire hooks with the intention of making them sink. Hen hackles are preferred by most fly tyers because they absorb water more readily. Another reason is that they have more action in the water. This makes them look much more life-like to the fish than stiff cockerel hackles would.

The very stiffest of cockerel hackles are used for dry flies. Small light wire hooks are used. If the pattern calls for a tall the very stiffest of material should be used. The tall and the hackles are very important because they keep the fly afloat.

There are several different types of the dry variety such as fan wings, upright wings, Variant, Spiders, Bivisibles. The last two mentioned can be fluttered across the top of the water to imitate a water spider or a fly that is struggling to rise off the water and fly away.

When trout are feeding on surface flies that hatch out when the sun goes down it is best to try and match the fly on the water with a close imitation. In fact most of the time they cannot be taken any other way. The fly must also pass over the fish with a natural drift. If it is dragged they will shy away from it. Don't think for a minute that they don't see it if it is floating quietly over the riffles, because they do as you will soon find out if you keep your eye on it.

When casting a dry fly it is best to have your line greased, also part of the leader if a long one is used. If this is not done your line will sink and drag the fly under possibilities of how well it is tied or water-proofed. Always cast up stream of a moss and up. As the slack line comes in gather it in with one hand. At the same time be careful not to drag the fly. If a fish strikes they will not be a lot of slack line to prevent you from setting the hook. If the fly gets snagged with water it will sink quickly. To remedy this make a few false casts back and forth and dry the fly off. The fly will then be good for a few more floats.

Fairly good dry flies can be made at home. One must be careful not to be sneaking or to have the mixture near a fire as it is very inflammable. Gasoline, lighter fluid, or dry cleaning fluid is good to dissolve the wax in. One quarter of a pound of paraffin wax shaved up fine and placed in a pint of the above liquids. It will take perhaps a day for a pint to dissolve. Then dip the flies in and quickly take them and put them in front of an electric fan or at the back of a vacuum cleaner. This evaporates the liquid and leaves the wax. It is important that they be dried off quickly as the liquid is harmful to the glue and head cement that holds the fly together.

A word more about line dressing. Be sure to purchase a special fly line dressing. If ordinary grease is used it might spoil or rot that pet line. Always wipe the spool to grease off the line with a clean cloth as it will make quite a mess in the rod guides if you don't.

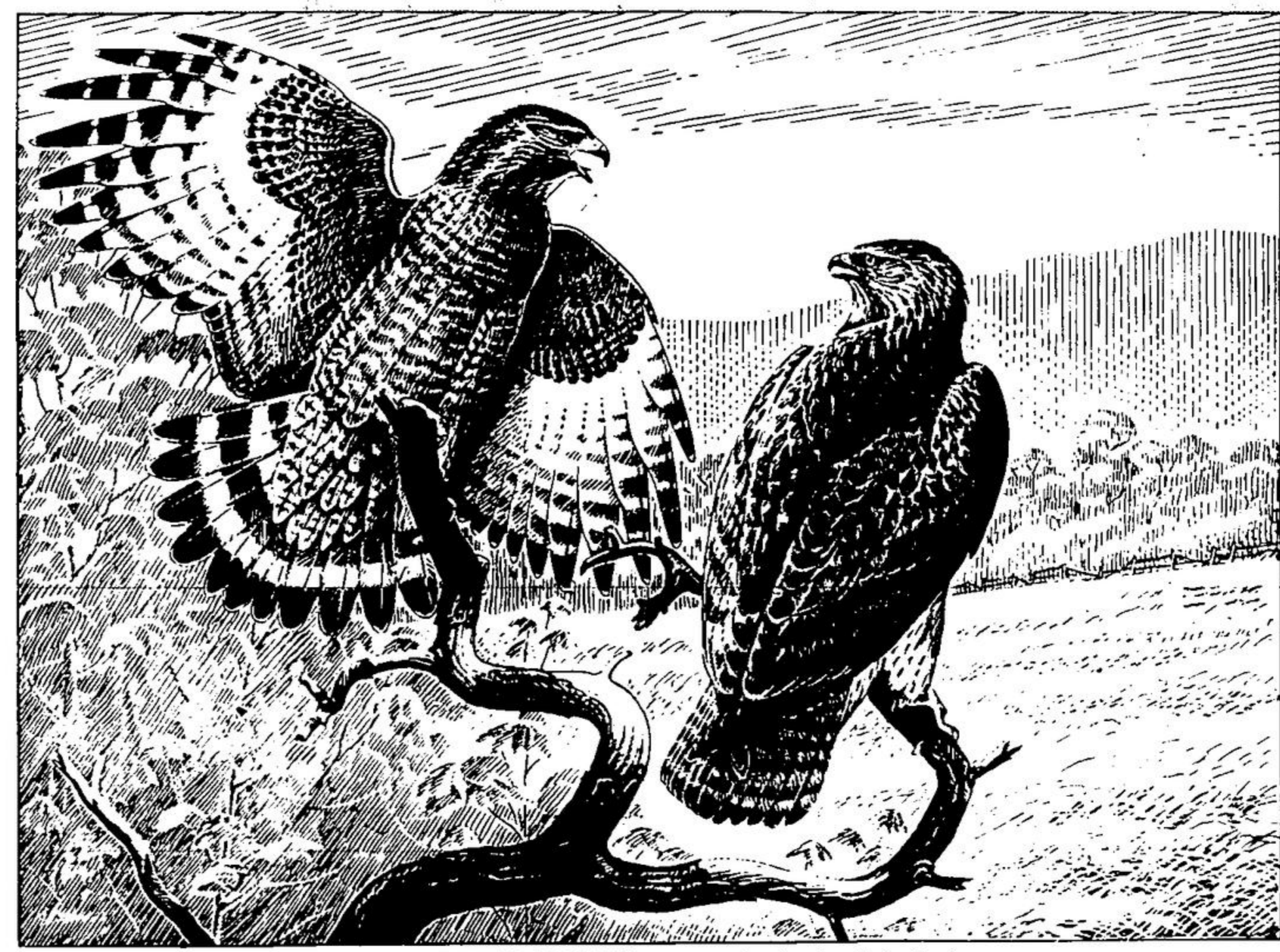
