**DAYFOOT - JULIEN WEDDING
IN CHENG TU, CHINA**

A wedding of interest in missionary circles took place Saturday afternoon, April 19th, in the chapel of the Canadian School, Chengtu, West China, when Miss Bessie M. Juliet of Wheatley, a missionary of the Women's Missionary Society of the United Church of Canada, became the bride of Rev. Arthur C. Dayfoot, a member of the Overseas Mission of the United Church. The groom, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. B. Dayfoot of Oak Bay, B.C. is a native of Georgetown and nephew of Mr. Harry Dayfoot of town.

The bride was given in marriage by Rev. George Sparling, a relative of the bride, and the ceremony was performed in the presence of about one hundred and fifty guests by Rev. Howard Veals, secretary of West China Mission, assisted by Rev. Liu Beh Hsiang, moderator of the Szechuan Synod of the Church of Christ in China. The chapel was beautifully decorated for the occasion and Mr. Karl Chiang, organist of St. Shen Tze Church played the wedding music and Dr. Harrison Mullett sang: "I'll walk Beside You." After the ceremony and the signing of the marriage register in the presence of all the guests, the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was administered to the bride and groom by Dr. Sparling, assisted by Mr. Veals and Mr. Liu.

The bride's gown was fashioned of ivory satin, made in China, and the full length wedding veil was arranged at the head with orange blossoms. She carried a bouquet of calla lilies and pink roses with long ribbon streamers caught up with sweet peas and fern. The bride's attendant was Miss Eleanor Burwell of Toronto. She wore a pale blue gown and carried American Beauty Roses. Rev. John Stinson of Loshan, assisted the groom. Dr. and Mrs. Lindsay were the guests of honor in the absence of the groom's parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. B. Dayfoot of Oak Bay, B.C. The ushers were Rev. Franklin Wu of Hsu Hwa Kai Church and Revs.

George Ball, Floyd Honey and Walton Tonge, who are at present studying the language in Chengtu.

After the ceremony a reception was held on the lawn of the W.M.S. home on the campus where large canopies had been erected for shade, and tea was served to the guests from a table centred with the bride's cake.

Later the bride and groom left for a ten-day honeymoon at a Canadian Inland Mission House at Kwanhsien, in the hills, from which point they may make trips further inland to visit Buddhist and Taoist temples.

Rev. and Mrs. Dayfoot will return to Loshan (formerly Kiating) which is about 10 miles from Chengtu, where they are stationed till after the summer. In October they will go to Fow Ling which is below Chungking, where they will be the only missionaries at present, and will engage in evangelistic and medical missionary work.
