Mr. and Mrs. W. Bradley of Hornby visited with Mr. and Mrs. John Stanish on Saturday.

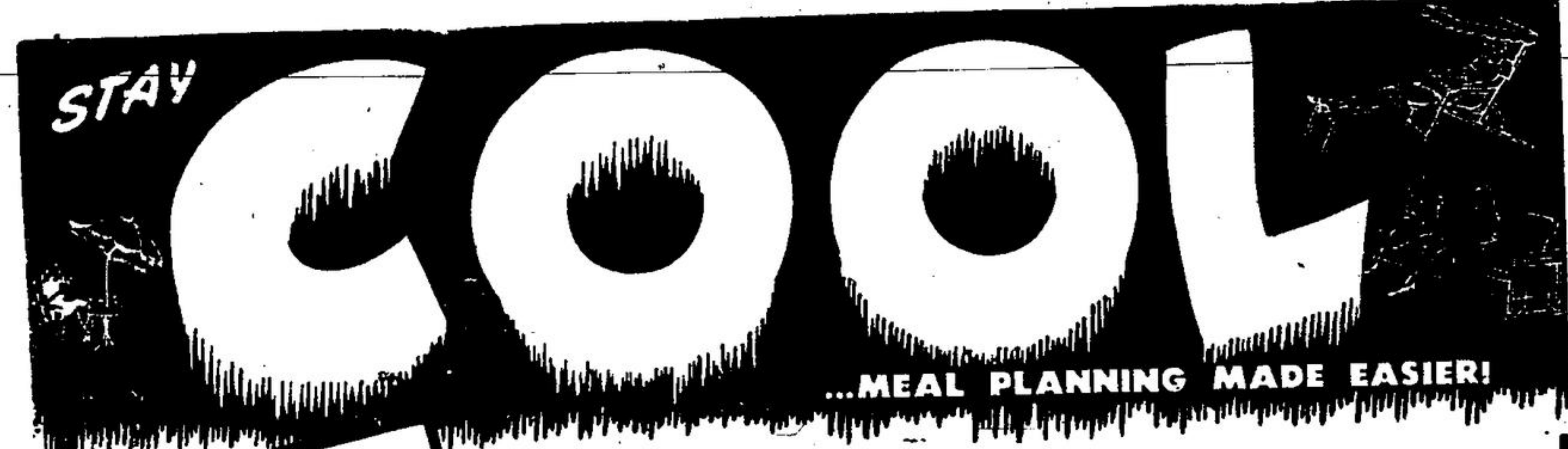
