beat until a little of the mixture dropped in cold water forms a soft ball. Remove from the heat and add the grated orange rind, 1/2 cup orange juice and the gelatin which has been sprinkled over 1 top of the cold water. Cool thoroughly. Whip the cream with a hand beater or an electric mixer at high speed until stiff, then add the orange mixture. Pour 1/2 cup orange juice into the bottom of a freezing tray of an electric refrigerator. Pour the orange cream mixture on top and freeze without stirring until set. Serves 6 to 8.
