Leslie Clan Hold 11th Family Reunion

On Saturday, July 26th, at the beautiful home of Mr. and Mrs. Wilfrid Leslie, R. R. 4, Georgetown, the eleventh reunion of the Leslie clan was held. One hundred and fifty-one enjoyed dinner from tables set on the lawn under the beautiful shade trees. They were descendants of John Leslie who was born in County Tyrone, Ireland, and settled on crown land, lot 22, 10th line, Esqueping, in 1821. Mr. Leslie was twice married, his first wife being Letty Ann Boks and his second wife, Catharine Sloan. He died in 1842 at the age of 76.

The Wilfrid Leslie farm has been in the Leslie family for 49 years. Thomas L. Leslie of Georgetown, the former owner, and now his son, Wilfrid, have always practiced the most up-to-date farming methods and the farm is one of the beauty spots in the county.
