**Driver of Truck Killed
In Collision with Bus**

One man was killed and six bus passengers suffered minor injuries in a collision between a bread truck and a Grey Coach Lines bus on No. 10 Highway, five miles south of Brampton last Friday afternoon.

Driver of the bread truck, which collided head-on with the Toronto-bound Owen Sound bus, Daniel K. Gibson, 48 of 106 Harvie Ave., Toronto, died en route to Peel Memorial Hospital.

Driver of the bus, Ralph King, Gainsborough Rd., Toronto, who was uninjured in the crash, said he had 12 passengers aboard at the time.

The six injured bus passengers were Bryan Robinson, 797 Windermere Ave., and Olinda Sauro, 104 Millwood Rd., Toronto; Mrs. W. Broughton and her son Edward, 29 Chryessa Ave., Mount Dennis; Thomas Morden, Georgetown and Mrs. Burton Mowatt, Acton.

Hospital authorities reported that Gibson, who had just finished his vacation at Little Lake, Midland, died of internal injuries. His wife is still at Midland.

He was a veteran of the First Great War and attended St. David's United Church. He played golf at Summerlea Golf Club. Besides his wife, he is survived by an 11-year-old son, Kenneth; two sisters, Mrs. J. Lambie, 78 Bicknell Ave., Toronto and Mrs. R. Sharpe, England and a brother in England.

Contents of the bread truck, which was completely wrecked in the accident, were strewn across the road. The bus was badly damaged. Both of the vehicles were in the ditch.

Provincial police reported there will be an inquest, which would be held at Brampton, by Dr. W. H. Brydon of Brampton.

**Plan Memorial Garden
To Late Minister**

The memory of the late Rev. Herbert S. Lovering, for twelve and one half years minister of Trafalgar Charge of the United Church (Munn's, Wesley and Sheridan Churches), will be perpetuated by a memorial garden at Munn's Corners, sixth line and Dundas Highway where the Trafalgar parsonage is located. The grounds of Munn's Church which is adjacent to the parsonage will be included in the layout.

The suggestion for a memorial garden originated with the Trafalgar Hunt Club organized by Mr. Lovering soon after coming to the Charge. The work will be started shortly. It will be landscaped with perennial borders, ornamental evergreens and shrubbery and fronted by a stone wall on the Dundas Highway. When the dedication takes place next in the Spring of 1948, a magnolia tree brought from Holland will be planted. The service of dedication will be conducted by members of Hamilton Conference and Halton Presbytery.

During Mr. Lovering's pastorate, he wrote several plays which were presented by the Trafalgar Dramatic Club members of which were chosen from the church congregations and for whom he especially wrote the parts. Proceeds from these presentations were used to help pay off the mortgage on the parsonage. Mr. Lovering and his parishioners had the satisfaction of seeing the mortgage burned in 1944.

Members of the Committee are E. R. Renoux and Milton McGeary, representing the Hunt Club, Munn's Church, Albert Walsom, Wesley, Stanley Turner, Sheridan, J. V. Stensson, landscape architect and chairman of the Committee and Rev. Bruce Hall, the present minister of Trafalgar Charge.
