Geo. W. Wheelock Dies On Vacation

(The following item, reprinted from the Woonsocket (Rhode Island) Times is of interest to our readers. Mrs. Wheelock spent her girlhood in Norval and last summer Mr. and Mrs. Wheelock visited with friends in the Norval district).

George W. Wheelock, 48-year-old veteran of both World Wars and husband of Mrs. Phoebe (MacDougall) Wheelock, superintendent of nurses at Woonsocket Hospital, died suddenly yesterday afternoon in Sandwich, Mass., of a heart attack. The couple had gone to Sandwich for a vacation at the beach and had arrived there Saturday. They resided at 418 Elder Ballou Meeting House Road.

Born here June 11, 1899, he was a son of the late Jesse C. and Ellen M. (Wales) Wheelock. The father was prominent here for many years, being at one time superintendent of the sewer department and having served in the R.I. General Assembly. The heart attack victim served in the navy during World War I and in the army during the recent global conflict. He was employed at the Narragansett Knitting Company plant here and was a member of Morning Star Lodge, F & AM. Besides his wife, he leaves one brother, Eugene C. Wheelock, one sister, Mrs. Frank T. Chick, of Springfield, and several nieces and nephews.


