

Hydro is pushing construction to meet the pressing demand for more electricity. The above huge generator will soon pour an additional 70,000 horsepower into the Hydro system from the DeCew Falls plant near St. Catharines.

Two other larger plants in eastern Ontario, now under construction, will deliver 81,000 horsepower next year and 360,000 horsepower by 1951. These two major developments, with the DeCew Falls addition, will provide Ontario with a further badly needed half-million

The growing output of Ontario's industries and farms benefits everyone but calls for more and more electricity. Even now that the war is over, the demand has not slackened but continues to mount. Hydro's peak load increased by more than 500,000 horsepower ever the highest wartime demand, an increase of 25%.
