HYDRO SPEEDS NEW POWER PLANTS

Hydro is pushing construction to meet the pressing demand for more electricity. The above huge generator will soon pour an additional 70,000 horsepower into the Hydro system from the DeCaw Falls plant near St. Catharines.

Two other larger plants in eastern Ontario, now under construction, will deliver 81,000 horsepower next year and 360,000 horsepower by 1951. These two major developments, with the DeCaw Falls addition, will provide Ontario with a further badly needed half-million horsepower.

The growing output of Ontario's industries and farms benefits everyone but calls for more and more electricity. Even now that the war is over, the demand has not slackened but continues to mount. Hydro's peak load increased by more than 500,000 horsepower over the highest wartime demand, an increase of 25%. Generating plants take a long time to build and could not be started during the war.

Few places in the world have as much electricity available per person as Ontario. However, we must use our electricity sparingly so that all homes, all farm services and all industries will receive their share.

27 Growers Competed In Halton 50 Bu. Winter Wheat Club

CECIL BRECKON TOPS ON FIELD SCORE

The Halton 50 Bushel Winter Wheat Club organized last fall by the Halton Crop Improvement Association resulted in 7 Halton Growers making entries. These fields we understand from J. E. Whitelock, Secretary of the Association, have recently been scored by Kenneth McNaught, of the Crops, Seeds & Weed Branch, Toronto.

The top twelve fields in the competition were as follows:

Small plots have been taken in each of 25 fields, and the samples are now being threshed at the Ontario Agricultural College. A separate prize list is offered for the high yielding fields. The Maple Leaf Milling Co. provided \$100.00 in prize money, part of which will be awarded on the field score and part on the yield.

In addition to above the same Company is providing \$30.00 for inter-county competition at the Royal Winter Fair. The three high competitors on the combined field and yield score will represent the Halton Club. At the 1946 Royal Halton was well to the fore; W. E. Breckon placing second, and H. B. Burkholder 3rd in this strong competition.

Entries are now being taken for the 1947-48 competition, which calls for a minimum of 5 acres, using either registered No. 1 Dawson's Golden Chaff or seed from Registered No. 1 Dawson's Golden Chaff, or sealed Cornell 595.

Plans are being made to officially open Normandy Boulevard Fall Fair evening, September 13th, with a civic function. Cr. Harry Hale is planning the evening, the Lorne Scots band will be on hand, and there may be a street dance.
