She worked with the Department of Agriculture until her marriage to Mr. Whitlock, who, at that time was ag-

cultural representative in Peel. Surviving are her husband and one son, James L. She also leaves a sister, Theima of Brampton and a brother, William in Montreal.

The funeral was held last Thursday from her late residence, Queen Street, Milton, with interment in Brampton Cemetery.
