On Friday at Norval, the game was even tighter, each team scoring once in the first three periods. Then one of those tricks of fate occurred when Thompson and Fendley were both off for penalties in the fourth and Fergus rapped in two quick goals to take the lead. Clark Lyons came back with a Norval goal in the dying moments of the game to make the final score 5-4 for Fergus.
