Rev. S. M. Roadhouse Was Methodist Minister Here

A Methodist minister on the Georgetown - Ashgrove circuit about thirty-five years ago, Rev. Samuel M. Roadhouse died suddenly at the Brantford General Hospital on Friday, September 5th in his 71st year.

He was a native of Peel County and entered the ministry at Wapatan, N.D. in 1888. Returning to Ontario, he held charges in Elmira, Georgetown, Tara, Woodstock, Galt, Brantford and Stratford. He retired from the ministry of St. John's Church, Stratford last June and had made his home in Brantford since that time.

Mr. Roadhouse was president of the Hamilton Conference of the United Church of Canada in 1929. He preached in Georgetown two years ago at anniversary services in the United Church.

Surviving are his widow, the former Harriet Shean of Owen Sound; two sons, W. J. Roadhouse, London, and Carl, Brantford, and three daughters, Mrs. Robert Malcolm, Galt, Mrs. S. G. Bowerman, Toronto, and Mrs. F. P. Farr, London. The funeral service was held in Colborne Street United Church, Brantford, on Monday, with interment following in Farrington Burial Grounds.
