Hospitalization Conference Honey Harbor

Group Hospitalization Service has made rapid growth in the Province of Ontario during the last year. A non-profit service planned, organized and operated by the people themselves, one year ago there were only four urban and three county groups operating such a service. Today there are twenty one, seventeen of which are County wide groups rendering this service to over nine thousand members, together with their dependants and giving this Hospitalization coverage to over thirty thousand Ontario people.

During the late summer of last year the groups then operating met together to talk over their problems and possibilities, at which time s Provisional Committee was appointed to render assistance and inform. ation to other groups wishing to organize. The rapid development this spring and early summer warranted the calling of another meeting of all the county and urban groups now in operation. It was therefore arranged to hold a Provincial Conference at Honey Harbor on September 19 and 20th in the Delaware Inn. Each county and urban group were asked to send two voting delegates to this conference and when it convened it was found nineteen of the twentyone groups were represented.

Mr. M. J. Brown, vice president and R. S. Heatherington, secretary, Halton Co-operative Medical Servivices, represented, Halton County at the Conference.

It was unanimously agreed that a Federation of all such groups was necessary in order to keep this valued service on sound ground, A proposed Constitution was drafted and presented to the delegates and after several hours of discussion a final draft was unanimously approved and the new Provincial organization set up to be known as Co-operative Medical Services Federation, A board of nine directors was elected who were charged with the responsibility of guiding the present and future developments in the Province of Ontario along safe and sound chan-- Freddy Martin els. Those elected were - President, Wm. McCarthy, Dufferin; vice pres., Howard Patterson, Went-- Phil Harris worth; Ed Lang, Grey; R. S. Heatherington, Halton; Lawrence Luland, Brockville; E. McKenny, Pet-- Delta Rhythm Boys erborough; Earl Reid, Leeds; Ed O'Dell, Lambton, Leonard Mitchel, Toronto. Mr. Paul Mechan, secretary, Mgr. Cumba Co-operative Health Services, Toronto was appointed Secretary and Treasurer.


