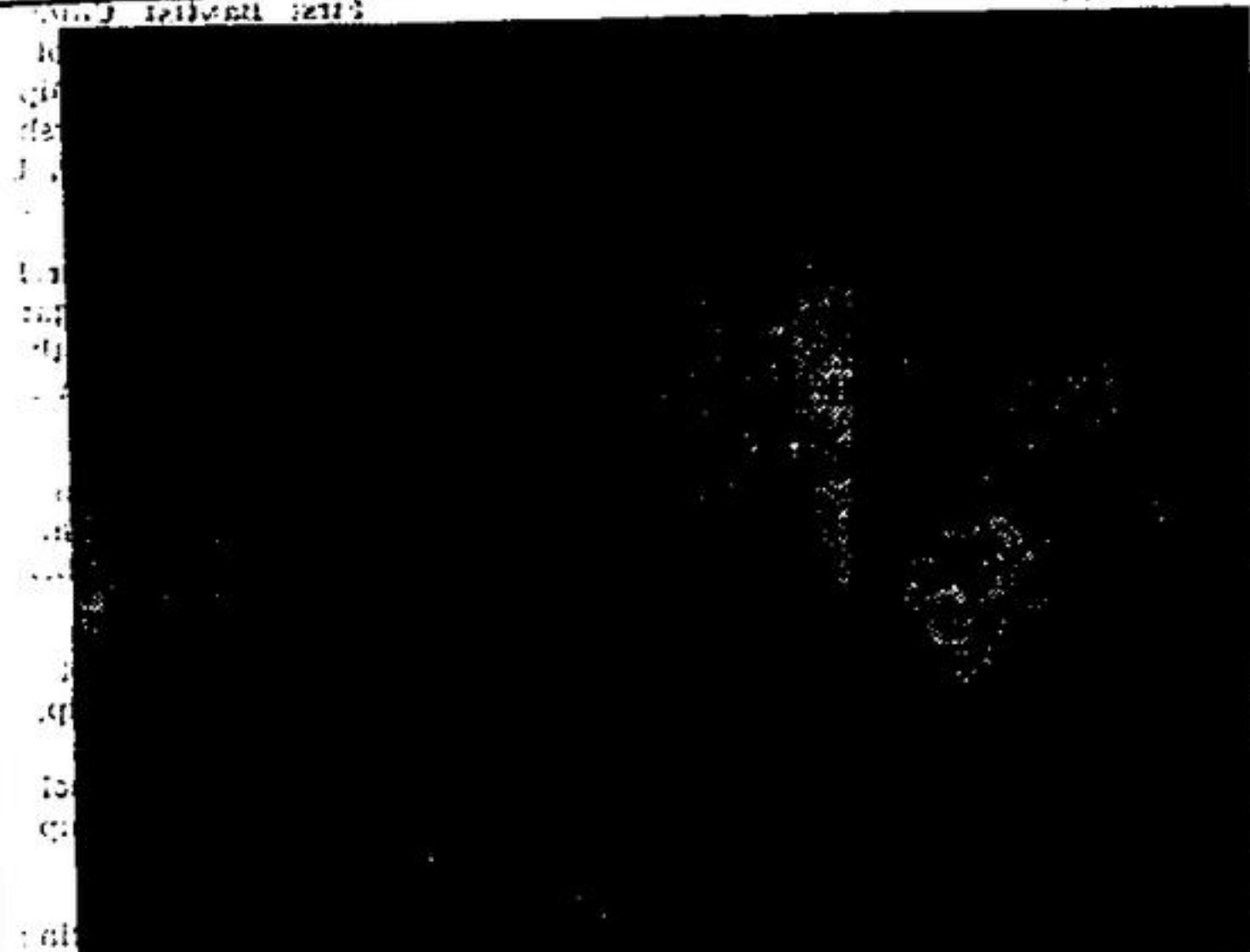

There will be an open season for ruffed grouse, spruce partridge, sharp-tailed grouse and partridge from the 11th of October to the 18th of October, 1947, inclusive, in the whole of Ontario except—the counties of Brant, Elgin, Essex, Haldimand, Halton, Kent, Lambton, Lincoln, Middlesex, Norfolk, Oxford, Peel, Perth, Waterloo, Welland, Wentworth and York, and the townships of Pickering, Whitby, and Whitby East in the County of Ontario, and the township of Puslinch in the County of Wellington.

Daily bag limit—five birds.
Season limit—twenty birds.
