Of the Municipal Corporation of the County of Halton to Restrict and Regulate the cutting of Trees was Passed at the Courthouse, Milton, on April 15th, 1947, and is Herewith Produced in Part as follows:

THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORA-TION OF THE COUNTY OF HAL-TON ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Except for dead, broken, stunted, fire-damaged, diseased or insect infested trees, Christmas trees and other trees that should be removed to improve growing conditions (such asthinnings and improvement cutting), no cedar tree of a diameter of less than seven inches, or twenty-two in circumference, nor any other tree of a diameter of less than fourteen in-We will meet our loved one there. ches, or forty-four inches in circum-_ Ever remembered by daughter, ference, measured stump high, (approximately eighteen under above the ground), shall be cut by any person within the County of Halton except as hereinafter provided.

2. Where in the opinion of the Trees Conservation Commision spe-Rev. Chas. C. 5. This by-law shall not: (a) interfere with the right of Ten Commandment for Modern the occupant of land to cut trees Christians: No. 10 - Thou shalf do for his own use:

> (b) interfere with any rights or powers conferred upon a Municipality by the Municipal Act.

(c) -interfere with the rights or powers of the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario or of any other Board or Commission which is performing its functions for or or behalf of the Government of Onta-

(d) apply to trees growing upon any highway or upon any opened road allowance.

(e) apply to trees growing in a woodlet having an area of not exceeding two acres.

(6) Any person who violates the provisions of this' by-law shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty not exceeding \$500.00 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.

No Appeals at Esquesing Court of Revision
