Did You Pay Income Tax For 1942?

The Government of Canada will repay the REFUNDABLE SAVINGS PORTION of 1942 Income Tax by March 31st, 1948. If you are one of those who have refundable savings a cheque will be mailed to you BUT—

Your correct present address is essential!

Correct addresses are available for most of those entitled to repayment, but a large number of taxpayers are constantly moving and others marry and their names change.

Cards on which to report changes of address or name are being sent to all householders in Canada. These are being distributed at the present time. Additional cards are available either at your district Income Tax office or your local Post Office. Do nothing if you live at the same address and have the same name as in 1942.

HALTON PRESBYTERY MEETS

A special meeting of Halton Presbytery of the United Church of Canada was held in Carlisle United Church, on Wednesday, November 6th, 1947, afternoon and evening sessions being held. Ordinarily morning and afternoon sessions are held, but this time an evening session was planned in the hope that more laymen might be free and able to attend the session. There was an improved attendance of laymen in the evening. It is too soon to say if this experiment will be repeated soon.

Two new ministers now serving charges in Halton Presbytery were introduced — Rev. Harry Pawson, of Oakville and Rev. A. D. Penman, of Lowville. Mr. Pawson came from London, Ontario. Rev. Russell McGillivray, now retired and living at Oakville, was present and was introduced. He recently came from Augustine United Church, Winnipeg.

The special meeting was arranged with a view to allowing a reasonable space of time in which to have the topic of "Christian Baptism" presented, and time to discuss the problems relating to the subject. The General Council has requested the Presbyteries of the United Church to deal with this subject, as well as the subject of the "Remarriage of Divorced Persons" and to report their findings to the secretary of General Council.

The Rev. Louis Pickering of Acton was in charge of the opening worship period and in his message, opened up the subject of "Christian Baptism." He was followed by Rev. R. C. Todd, of Georgetown, who dealt with the same subject, but from a differing approach. Considerable discussion ensued, only one resolution being passed, as follows:

"We recommend that it become a universal rule of the United Church that all baptisms be performed before a Church congregation, except in certain cases of necessity."

A very stimulating and enlightening message was brought to the members and friends at the supper hour, when Dr. Walter Strangway, a medical missionary on furlough from Angola, Africa, related the story of his work there. We dare not dispute the effectiveness of our Missionary Enterprises. The power of the Christian Gospel to save the world from destruction was made clear.

The chairman of Presbytery, Rev. O. W. Porter, of Milton, will be moving to Toronto at the end of December. Rev. N. J. Truax, of Carlisle, was elected to complete the term of the chairman—as chairman of Halton Presbytery, and Rev. R. C. Todd of Georgetown was elected to complete Mr. Porter's term as a member of the Settlement Committee.

Rev. B. W. Hall, of Trafalgar, led in the evening worship period.

Rev. Dr. J. E. Mutchmor, secretary of the Board of Evangelism and Social Service, was introduced by the Convenor of the Presbytery Committee on Evangelism and Social Service.

Dr. Mutchmor also spoke concerning subject of "Remarriage of Divorced Persons" and considerable discussion followed, but it was decided to bring in no resolutions until the matter has been studied and discussed more thoroughly.

Dr. Mutchmor also spoke encouraging the need of relief in many of the hard areas. He presented a very clear picture of the various areas of need and related the ways in which the United Church is cooperating with various worthy agencies overseas to see that relief material reaches the most needy people. The people of the Church are urged to give more generously and to cooperate with Government agencies in trying to prevent inflation and consequent disaster. This effort will require unselfishness, patience and love. Gift parcels are most welcome.

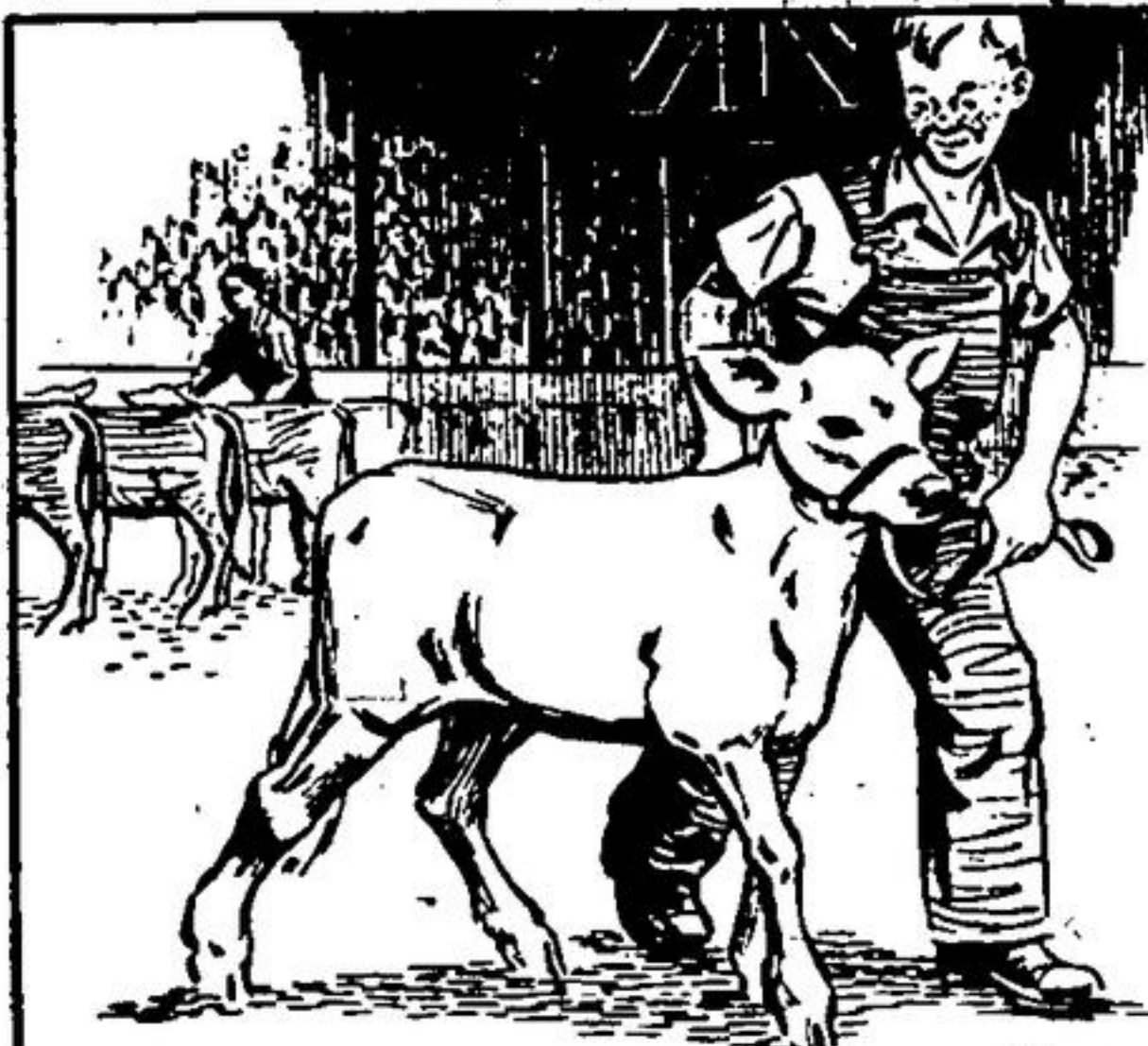

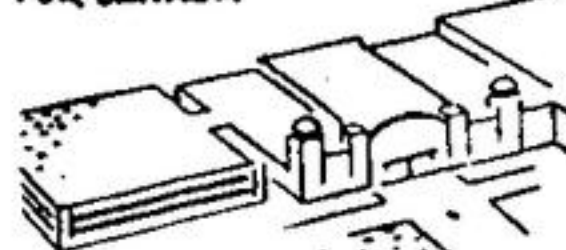
