JEAN CHESTER AND ERNEST WEST WIN JUNIOR FARMER PUBLIC SPEAKING CONTEST
A crowded auditorium greeted the six contestants in the Halton Junior Farmer Public Speaking Competition held in the Milton High School on Friday evening of last week. In the young ladies' competition, Norval Club was represented by Miss Jean Chester, who spoke on "The Farm Girl"; Palermo Club by Miss Lorna Lawrence, who took as her subject, "Character"; and the Acton Club by Miss Bessie Reid, on the subject "The Life of Winston Churchill."
In the young men's contest, Lloyd Wislan, representing Palermo Juniors took as his subject "Russia"; Stanley Jay of Milton on the subject of "Newfoundland"; while "Building a World Citizenship" was the subject of the address delivered by Ernest West of the Acton Junior Farmers club.
The evening's programme also included a contest in amateur entertainment which brought forward entries from Palermo, Acton and Norval Clubs. In this latter contest, six young people representing the Palermo Juniors, presented a skit based on the song "Fussin' and A'Feudin'"; Don Van Goozen of Acton rendered two very fine selections on his alto horn; while Miss Izney Keen from the Norval Club presented two very clever readings of her own composition.
Miss Edna Aitken, president of the Halton Juniors, was a very able chairman for the evening, and the large crowd enjoyed to the full the six splendid addresses, and other numbers presented in the amateur entertainment. Mrs. Percy Merry, Hornby, and Messrs. Leo Klein and Geo. E. Elliott of Milton, had no easy task in arriving at their decision and in making their awards, which were very ably announced by Mr. Elliott.
In the public speaking section, first place in the young ladies' contest went to Miss Jean Chester of Norval, while Ernest West of Acton, took the award in the young men's contest.
In the amateur entertainment the Palermo Club took first honours. All three winning awards will now represent Halton County in the district contest which is to be held in the Waterdown High School on Friday evening, November 21st.
Another pleasing feature of the evening was the presentation of the Halton Federation of Agriculture trophy, to the members of the Acton Club who won the Halton Junior Farmer inter-club baseball series. The presentation of the trophy was made on behalf of the Halton Federation, by Agricultural Representative J. E. Whitlock.
HALTON JUNIORS AT THE ROYAL WINTER FAIR
As usual, Halton Junior Farmers will be well represented in the various Junior activities at the Royal Winter Fair, which opens on November 18th. In the inter-county livestock judging competitions for the Jeffrey Bull Memorial Trophy, which is open to county teams of three young men under 28 years of age, the Halton representatives will be Wm. Alexander, Ward Brownridge, and Douglas Currie, all of Georgetown R. R. 2.
Halton's winning Dairy Calf Club team in the Provincial contests will again be in action at the Royal, where they will meet the winning Provincial Dairy Calf Club teams from the other Provinces. Halton's representatives in this contest, which is open to teams of two Club members under 21 years of age, will be the Ontario champions, namely Hend DeVries of Georgetown, and David Pelletier, of Milton.
This year for the first time, Halton Juniors will be represented in the contest for the King's Guineas. This is open to the winners of the Baby Beef section for Clubs organized under the Boys' Calf Club Policy. Halton's representatives here will be Alex Buchanan of Moffat and Evelyn McCann of Milton, who were the 1st and 2nd prize winners respectively in the Calf Club Achievement Day in the Baby Beef Section, which was held at the Milton Fair.
The Acton boys' Beaver Oat Club will also be represented in the special Grain section open to Grain Club members from all parts of Canada. George Burkholder of Freeman, and Geo. Wilson of Georgetown will compete in this special section.
Our readers will join with us in extending to all of the young people named, our best wishes for further successes in their various Junior activities.
