**Rev. J. E. Reid was Former Toronto Presbytery Moderator**

Minister of All Saints United Church, Toronto, for 37 years and former Moderator of Toronto Presbytery, Rev. J. Ewing Reid died at his home, 314 Indian Road, after a lengthy illness.  
 Born in Georgetown, Mr. Reid was one of a family of eleven children of the late Henry Reid and Eliza Scott. He received his early education at Norval and Guelph Collegiate. He taught school for a time before attending the University of Toronto where he graduated in Arts in 1903 and in theology in 1906 from Knox College.  
 Mr. Reid began his career in the ministry at Royce Avenue Mission where he held services in a second-hand tent. In 1909 he took over All Saints Presbyterian Church, which later joined the United Church under his guidance. He continued to serve this charge until his retirement in June of 1946.  
 Always active in church affairs, he was a past president of the ministerial Association, Toronto, as well as being a convener of the Religious Educational Committee of Toronto Conference.  
 Mr. Reid also took an active interest in sports and enjoyed curling, golf and fishing trips. He was a member and past master of Killwinning Lodge, A.P. & A.M., and served as chaplain for some time.  
 Surviving are his wife, formerly Caroline M. Sheridan, and a daughter, Miss Mary Reid. A sister, Mrs. James Leslie (Sarah) lives in Guelph and a brother, George Reid, in Brampton.

LEARNING REFRIGERATION
